# Guide To Certificate Requirements

You can present your students with the opportunity to earn a Year 10 General or Academic Certificate and a Year 12 General or Academic Certificate. The **Certificate Requirements** sheets outline which subjects (required and optional) are necessary for certificate achievement.

PACE 1085 is the commencement of certificate requirements. A series of 12 completed PACEs constitutes one credit toward graduation. Each certificate requires a specific number of credits. It will take between 2 and 3 years to meet the Year 10 requirements, and a further 2 years to complete Year 12 requirements, depending upon the student's ability and workload.

#### Year 10 Considerations (Students in years 8, 9 and 10)

When a student commences PACE 1085 in Maths or English, it is necessary to consider expanding from the 5 core subjects (Maths, English, Social Studies, Science, Word Building), and Literature, to include Bible and Elective courses. It would be wise to have the student commence either New Testament Survey or Typing at this point.

**Maths** - Students considering tertiary entrance (certain TAFE courses or University) should choose a course of study which majors in maths. This is because they will sit for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), 33% of which is a maths test. We recommend that such students choose Algebra I followed by a combination of Geometry and Algebra II. See notes on the Year 12 certificate requirements.

Business Maths is helpful for those who wish to delay Algebra I until they are more mature. It is also a helpful subject for students entering the workforce after graduation.

General Business is a subject which is mainly a reading subject. There are no mathematical calculations required of the student in this subject. It is a useful overview of business principles, and may be chosen in the elective category for a year 10 certificate.

Students with low mathematical aptitude can gain a year 10 **General** Certificate by choosing Maths Overview followed by Business Maths or General Business.

**Social Studies** - Complete World Geography or World History, then complete Australian History.

**Core Subjects** - For a Year 10 **Academic** Certificate, students are required to complete 2 courses in each core subject, plus an additional course in two of the following:

Maths, English, Social Studies, Science

For example, a student considering a future in maths/science/technical areas would be advised to complete extra Maths and Science courses. Students considering the humanities field may choose English and Social Studies as extra credits. Algebra I is compulsory for a Year 10 Academic Certificate.

## Year 12 Considerations (Students in years 11 and 12)

**Maths** - The single maths credit required is a minimum. We recommend that extra maths courses be taken by students anticipating further study at the tertiary level. They ought to choose advanced mathematical subjects for the following reasons:

- Tertiary prerequisite knowledge. Some university courses assume that a student has prior learning in that subject area before commencing the course.
- 2. SAT. One third of the SAT is a maths test. It is used to determine whether a student is able to achieve at a tertiary institution or not.

**English** - English 1121 - 1132 is American Literature. English 1133 - 1144 is British Literature.

Students who anticipate humanities studies at tertiary level may wish to include one of these choices as their English course and the other as an elective.

**Social Studies** - Please refer to the Scope and Sequence for a description of each course. Some are explained in the High School Electives and some are in the College Electives section of the Basic Edition Scope and Sequence.

**Science** - Students anticipating technical studies at the tertiary level should choose Chemistry and Physics.

### **General Considerations**

It is important that your student does not just meet the minimum certificate requirements but aspires to gaining maximum preparation for his/her life's calling.

Choose the more academic subjects which will provide more options for your student upon graduation. However, if your student has difficulties, contact an ACA academic advisor for further advice.

Please do not underestimate the student's ability or the education you are providing. Bring your child to his/her potential. Home-educated graduates have in the past shown themselves to be successful in the tertiary, business and industrial spheres. Your child can succeed in God's chosen plan for him.
